

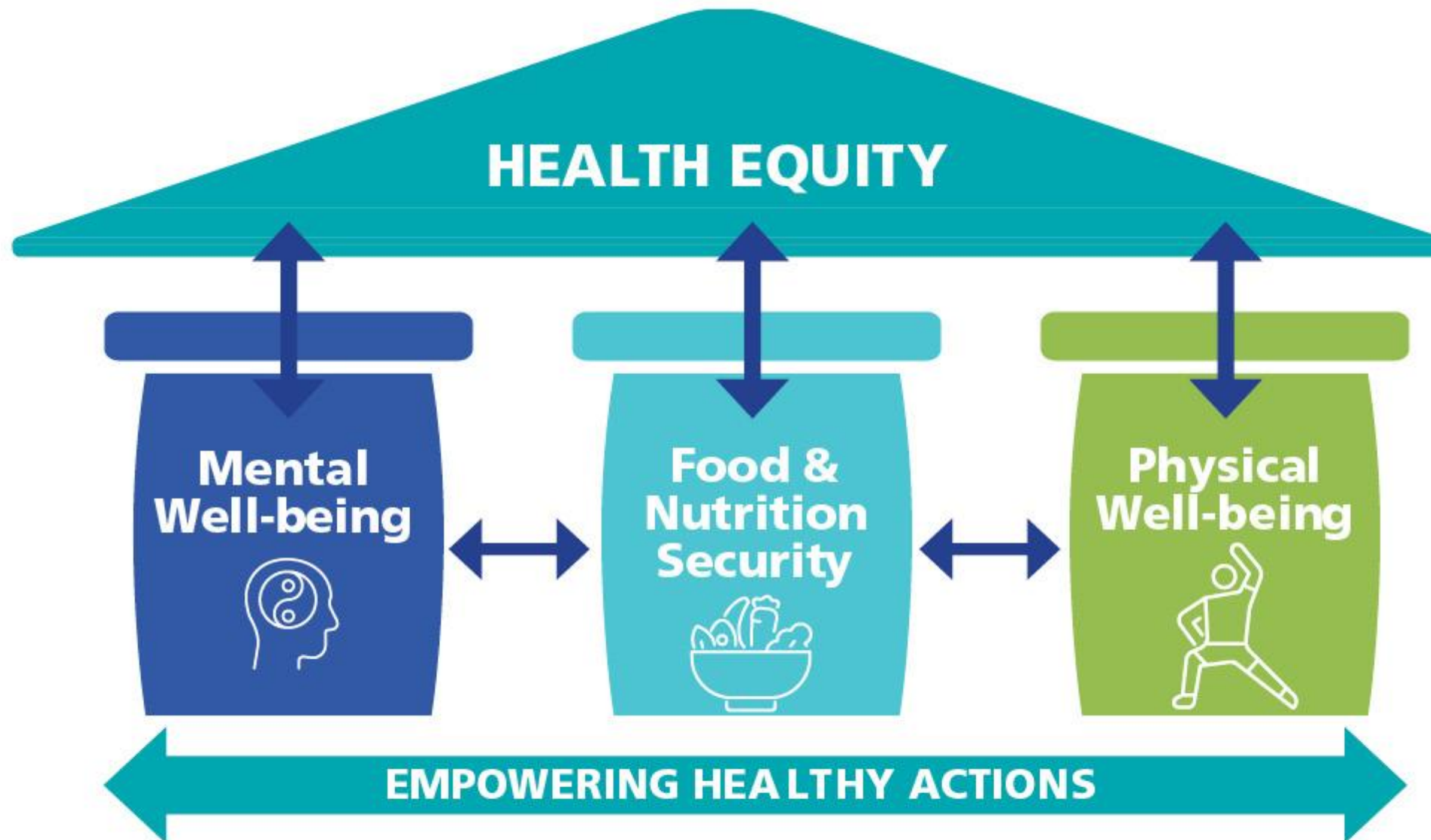

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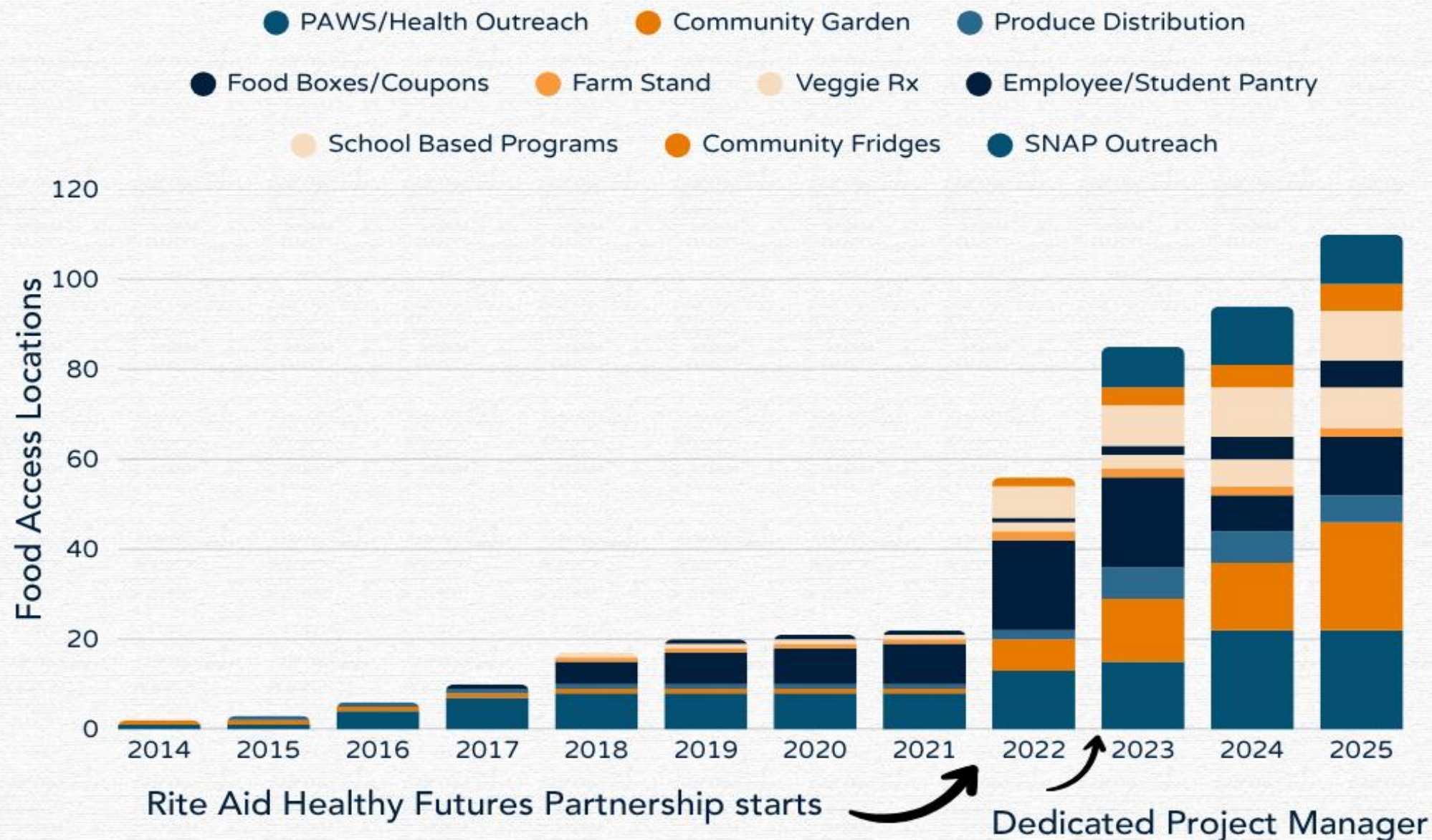

Community Health in Action – Lebanon County

- **PAWS – Pantry and Wellness Support**
 - Community health nurses offer free health education and various screenings, as well as flu shots seasonally
 - Served 1,717 community members in Lebanon in FY25
 - 3 locations: Lebanon County Christian Ministries, JOY pantry and Caring Cupboard
- **Community Flu Clinic**
 - Held at Lebanon High School each year
 - 2024 – delivered 568 flu shots last year
- **School Assessments**
 - Assist with height, weight, vision and hearing screenings at all Lebanon School district schools
 - 5,681 students screened last year
 - Vision clinic – 47 eye exams and 42 glasses delivered in FY25
- **Health Outreach** at Juniper Village

The **LION Mobile Clinic** uses a student-led free clinic model to increase access to health care and proactive health choices for under-resourced communities of Pennsylvania.

Health services provided:

- Blood pressure screening
- SDH screening
- Preventive health screening
- Tobacco use cessation counseling
- Vaccinations
- Skin and CRC screening
- Health literacy education
- Culinary medicine

Funding: Federal grants, Foundation grants, Penn State Cancer Institute, Penn State CTSI, University Park Regional Campus

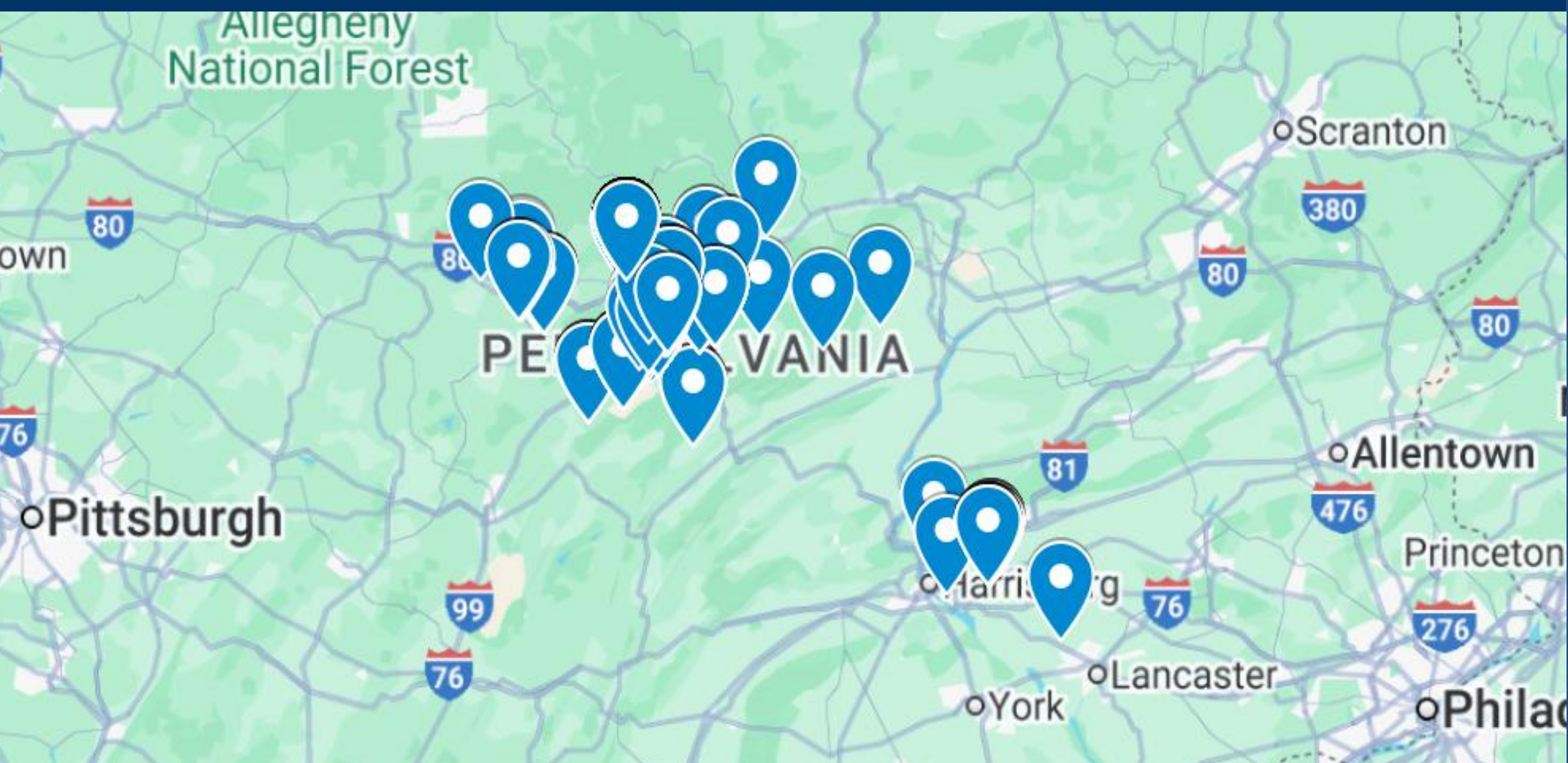

Wellness at Work

- Studies show that healthy employees contribute to stronger workplaces and communities.
 - Improved quality of life and health outcomes
 - Reduced health care cost
 - Improved productivity
- In 2024, the Office of Community Outreach and Engagement at Penn State Cancer Institute began to offer in-person health education and some cancer screening services to employers in central Pennsylvania.
 - 8 events (2 in Lebanon) with 826 educated employees
 - 104 employees received CRC screening (at-home FIT kits)



Wellness at Work

Penn State Cancer Institute is partnering with employers to provide opportunities for cancer prevention, screenings, and primary care at workplaces:

- Host health events with LION Mobile Clinic
- Offer in-person or virtual educational health presentations
- Provide educational materials and resources
- Assess interest in programs and solicit ideas
- Create tailored worksite wellness plans
